#### 1. Discussion and/or Motion Items:

- a. Commissioner Prentice made a motion to approve Ordinance <u>2861</u> Authorizing the sale of two real properties on Miller Street with PIN 04-06-179-019 and PIN 04-06-179-020. Commissioner Adleman second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- b. Commissioner Adleman made a motion to approve Ordinance <u>2862</u> Implementing a Municipal Grocery Retailers; Occupation Tax and a Municipal Grocery Service Occupation Tax. Commissioner Prentice second the motion. Administrator Hoppes said the tax was removed from the state, and municipalities have the ability to pick up the tax if they choose to. Finance Director, Don Elliott said the sales tax is per quarter, and the tax amount loss is unknown. Mr. Elliott said most sales are through gas stations, and the impact to residents would be minor. Mr. Elliott said it's better to continue the tax. Mayor Fitzgerald said the tax is not a new tax, and he would support continuing the tax. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- c. Commissioner Morse made a motion to approve Resolution 6632 Approving a Professional Services Proposal with Fehr-Graham to prepare an Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Open Space Land Acquisition and Development Grant (OSLAD) Grant Application. Commissioner Adleman second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- d. Commissioner Adleman made a motion to approve Resolution <u>6633</u> Approving the purchase of a Schwarze A9 Monsoon Street Sweeper from R.N.O.W., Inc. at a cost not to exceed \$380,628.00 for the City of South Beloit Public Works. Commissioner Morse second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- e. Council discussed the Sewer Rate Ordinance. Wastewater Superintendent, Jeff Reininger spoke about the benefits to having, and the use of Class A sludge. Mr. Reininger spoke about the critical need for lift stations 1 and 2 in order to provide future growth. Council reviewed the options for the number of years and determined increase would occur yearly for a period of 7 years.
