#### Town of Beloit FF's Expand Skills with Motor Pump Operator and Aerial Training



Town of Beloit Fire Department continues its commitment to providing high-quality training by offering both Motor Pump Operator (MPO) and aerial apparatus instruction to its personnel. These programs are part of the department's ongoing effort to create more opportunities for firefighters to step into driving and operational roles.

The MPO class, taught by Beloit Fire Lieutenant Scott Formankiewicz, equipped participants (Beloit, and Town of Beloit) with the knowledge and hands-on experience

needed to safely operate fire apparatus and manage pump systems during emergency responses. The training focused on vehicle operations, pump

mechanics, water supply, and tactical deployment.

In addition to the MPO course, several firefighters completed aerial training, focusing on the safe operation and positioning of ladder trucks during fireground operations. This training ensures personnel are well-prepared to utilize aerial apparatus effectively during complex incidents.



**Engine 211 Assists in Knocking Down Beloit House Fire** 



The Town of Beloit Fire Department's Engine 211 played a key role in helping extinguish a house fire in the City of Beloit. The fire broke out in a single-story home with heavy smoke and flames visible from the rear of the structure.

City of Beloit crews began an aggressive fire attack and search after reports of a possible person trapped. Engine 211 arrived quickly and supplied water to the first engine on scene, then assisted with a second hose line to help knock down the fire from the back of the house.

Their efforts helped bring the fire under control and allowed other crews to begin overhaul. Thankfully, no one was found inside the home, and the fire was fully extinguished with no injuries reported.
